Section Title. This local law shall be known as "A local law to override the tax levy limit established in General Municipal Law Section 3-ca"

Section 2, Legislative Intent It is the intent of this local Law to permit the Town of Watson to adopt a budget for the fiscal year commencing January 1 , 2015 which will require a property tax levy in excess of the "tax levy limit" as defined in General Municipal Law Section 3-c.

Section 3- **Authority**. This focal law is adopted pursuant to subdivision 5 of General Municipal Law Section 3-c, which expressly authorizes the Town Board to override the property tax levy limit for the coming fiscal year by the adoption of a local law approved by a vote of sixty per cent of the members of the Town Board.

Section 4a Tax Levy Limit Override - The Town Board of the Town of Watson is hereby authorized to adopt a budget for the fiscal year commencing January 1, 2015 which will require a real property tax levy in excess of the tax levy limit calculated and allowed pursuant to the terms of General Municipal Law Section 3-c.

Section 5. Severability- If a Court determines that any clause, sentence, paragraph, . subdivision or part of this local law is invalid for any reason, such Court's order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this local law which shall remain in effect.

Section 6. Effective Date. This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.
